Notes from the Pastor

While Christians worldwide grapple with devastating hurricanes, wildfires, and floods that seem to arrive with increasing frequency, the anniversary of the Nicean Creed offers profound wisdom for our environmental crisis. This year marks 1700 years since the Council of Nicaea gathered in 325 CE— and its ancient affirmation creed provides the essential theological foundation for a new movement taking shape across global Christianity.

The 1700th anniversary of Nicaea provides more than historical context for creation care—it offers the Trinitarian theology that makes the emerging Feast of Creation not merely environmental activism, but authentic Christian worship of the creating and sustaining God. So what does the Councial of Nicaea, or its creed, have to do with a Feast of Creation? When the Council affirmed that Christ is "true Good from

true God" through whom "all things were made," It established that creation care isn't optional Christian ethics but flows from core of our relationship with God.

A Feast of Creation celebrates God, not just creatures, but the One creating. With a Feast of Creation, God, creator of all things, is celebrated not just in the past tense, but in God's continued presence and loving relationship with all creation.

"I believe in on God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen." This Nicean affirmation that God is "maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, see and unseen" becomes not ancient doctrine but urgent contemporary truth.

In addition to participating in the international ecumenical plans for an annual Feast of Creation, Methodists lift up our emphasis on the stewardship of creation and call for ecological

When: Saturday, October 25, 2025 from 2:00 p.m.—4:00 p.m.


Where: Wesley United Methodist Church

In 2024, OACP distributed over 3 millions pounds of food and served over 2,500 families facing food insecurity in our community each month. This volume of distribution is only possible with the support of OACP partners, donors, and volunteers.

MONTHLY MISSION FOCUS

Oshkosh Area Community Food Pantry

OACP serves our neighbors in southern Winnebago county from all walks of life, of all ages and stages. In 2024 OACP distributed over 218,000 snacks and over 25,300 pounds of fresh fruit to area students though its School Pantry Program partnership. Additionally, OACP welcomed 3,338 children into its Kids Corner shopping experience throughout the year.

The OACP mission and operation is 99% run by volunteers dedicated to ACP. From stocking and sorting, registration, and checkout, to delivering and picking up food, OACP volunteers are what allow OACP to make the impact it does in the Oshkosh area. In 2023 OCAP volunteers dedicated 22,453 hours serving those in our community.

Here is a story that came directly from one of our guests: "The Oshkosh Area Food Pantry has been a blessing to our family. The staff are kind, helpful and professional; even with all the volunteer staff. The food for our family has seriously been a saving grace during this time of inflation and uncertainty. I no longer wonder if we can purchase enough to feed our family. Thank you for your hard work and dedication to our community."





Adult Studies

There are three different adult studies available each week for you to attend.

- 1. Sunday morning adult bible study class meets after church each week for a Lectionary Study.
- 2. Wednesday morning class meets each Wednesday at 10:00 a.m.. They are discussing lectionary each week, but are looking into a possible book study. Stay tuned for more information.
- 3. Thursday afternoon class meets from 2:30 p.m.—4:00 p.m. each week. This class will be a Bible study on the book of Revelation. This study will offer more details than just causal reading.

UMC Wesley CORNER

The United Methodist Church is a connectional church. Churches join together to do those things that can be done best by a large number of churches. Missions is where connectionism works so well.

The Wisconsin Board of Global Ministries is the missional instrument of the United Methodist Church. As disciples of Christ, members of the Wisconsin Board of Global Ministries and its committees are challenged to inspire and educate districts, cir5cuits, local churches, and individuals about the many mission opportunities available. The Board also recommends ministries to be funded through Conference apportionment dollars and designated funds, The Mission Motivation Team is on of those committees. One of its responsibilities is to recommend ministries to be designated as Advance Specials.

On Saturday, November 15th the Mission Motivation team is offering a training filled with information to help churches plan their Outreach/Mission opportunities. Gues speakers will share information about the Mosaic Covenant (formerly Rainbow Covenant), Ingathering and Midwest Mission, plarm mats for disaster relief, itinerant missionaries traveling in Wisconsin that could come to your church, Volunteers in Mission and Wisconsin Conference projects, local and national missions and our sister program with Bolivia.

Two churches in each of the five districts will act as hosts. Speakers will be speaking over zoom after each speaker a time is set aside for conversation among the people at each site. The time frame is registration at 9:00 a.m. with the first speaker at 9:30 a.m. The session will close at 12:30 p.m. Snacks will be available. No meal will be served.

A highlight of these sessions is the opportunity for people on mission team and anyone else from the local church to have a chance to get acquainted and possibly learn how they can connect through missions. Any person can go to any site. They are all held on the same day, Saturday, November 15th.

The cost is \$25/church or charge and for us will be paid by Wesley. In our Northeast District, the meetings will be help at First United Methodist Church in Oshkosh and Wausau First UMC. This is a great opportunity and we do not need to travel far.
